Dear Parents,

The best way for a child to improve in reading proficiency is to READ! This should be done on a regular basis in order to gain the maximum benefit. Spend some time with your child each day engaged in reading. Read to your child and have your child read to you. Discuss the stories together to ensure comprehension.

If your child reads story books easily, he/she may be ready for chapter books! Start him/her off with some simple chapter books. Some good beginner chapter book series include <u>Henry and Mudge</u> (levels 2 and 3), <u>Young Cam Jansen</u>, <u>Magic Tree House</u>, and <u>Junie B</u>. <u>Jones</u>.

Please, please, please set a goal for your child to read at least 10-15 minutes <u>per day</u> over the summer break. "Summer learning loss" is a big issue and can result in losing up to a full grade level of reading ability. It is <u>so</u> important that your child does not lose ground in reading over the summer. Please visit your local library to check out books. Read, read, read!

We also cannot stress enough how important it is for your child to know the basic addition facts through 18 (9+9). Everything they will learn in math in second grade will build on these facts. Please go over these facts <u>frequently</u> over the summer. There are many <u>free</u> websites where they can play games to review addition and subtraction facts. Flash cards are also a great way to practice and review.
